Athletic:

1. The Varsity Girls Basketball team finished their season 9-12 this year. The girls did an outstanding job moving up in classification from single A to double AA playing in a highly competitive conference. The highlight of their season was beating Wash High on senior night in front of their home crowd.
2. The Varsity Boys Basketball team finished their season 15-8. They finished in second place in their conference with a 9-3 record and qualified for the WPIAL playoffs for the first time in 5 years losing a heartbreaker to Summit Academy 73-71 in the first round. The team played well this year coming off a 3-19 season last year.
3. The Varsity Wrestling team finished their dual meet schedule this year at 6 – 3. They qualified for the WPIAL playoffs losing to the eventual WPIAL champ Burrell in the first round. Nick Candelore had an

outstanding individual season this year finishing the year 28 – 7. Nick finished 4th in WPIALs and qualified for Regionals at IUP this year.
