Scholarship Scams Scam Warning Signs

You have to pay a fee

Money-back offers or guarantees

Credit card or bank account information required

Provides "exclusive" information

Common Scams

"Phishing"

Unsolicited emails that bear the logo of your bank or credit card

Appear legitimate but are traps to lure you into giving out your personal or account information

NEVER give out Social Security, credit card or bank account numbers to unsolicited emails or calls

"Pharming"

Unsolicited emails that encourage you to visit a website or click on suspicious links

Make sure your inbox spam filters are up to date

BE CAREFUL about giving out your contact information or email address

Dual Enrollment Opportunities CCBC High School Academies

In partnership with the Community College of Beaver County, students in grades 11 and 12 have the opportunity to earn up to 28 college credits in conjunction with earning a high school diploma. CCBC offers set curriculum in person campus or virtually. All costs associated with college classes or online courses including but not limited to tuition, transportation, related materials and supplies are the responsibility of the student and family. Aviation Academy: The CCBC Aviation Academy program provides exploration into Professional Pilot, Air Traffic Control, and Unmanned Aerial Vehicles career paths.

Criminal Justice Academy: The CCBC Criminal Justice Academy provides hands-on experience in classrooms, mock crime scenes, and other real-world environments to prepare students for careers in law enforcement.
