**Boys basketball** - Varsity team is currently 9-4 and on top of section 4 play. The JV team is currently 3-3 overall. 8 th grade team is 7-2 overall and the 7 th grade team is 6-2 overall. Boys basketball senior night will be held on 2/6 vs. Carmichaels at 7pm.

**Girls basketball** – Varsity team is currently 9 – 4 overall and in 2 nd place in their conference. Raney Staub broke the 1000 point mark for her career in a victory over Brentwood. The JV team is currently 4-2 overall. Girls basketball senior night will be held on Feb 8 th at 530pm vs. Sto Rox.

**Wrestling** - Boys team is currently 1-4 in team duals. Individually Braedon Welsh won the Tricada tourney and finished in the top twelve at Powerade. #### **SPECIAL EDUCATION**

**Elementary Life Skills**: Consultation with Watson Institute is ongoing. Monthly team meetings are being held with the classroom staff, related service providers, and administration to provide a forum for discussion. There is continued progress with all students. Additionally, facilities is preparing information about the proposed move for the sensory room.

# **Facilities and Grounds**

Over the month of December 2023 and early January 2024 the Facilities Department at Fort Cherry School district have been very busy. The time before the Holiday is a full of activities and celebrations. With the excitement of the holidays and celebrations, the cleaning staff have had extra work. The staff have handled this time very well and no disruption in general school function was affected. During this time of year our indoor winter sports begin to take center stage, this pushes more events into our gyms

and wrestling rooms. Our staff has done a tremendous job keeping our facilities welcoming and prepared for these events.

Over the holiday break we were able to change the filters on all of our HVAC units, as well as grease all the belts and grease points on each unit. Our daylight staff also returned the PTO Christmas decorations to storage in Hickory and helped move materials and chairs around for the Holiday concerts on campus. With this past week's first big dip into the winter weather our staff has performed well, keeping the campus clear of snow and ice and again welcoming to community and visitors. This is much the same as grass and landscaping in the warmer months, a lot of time effort and attention must be paid to this. The ice and snow cause issue with community safety and that continues to be at the top of our efforts.
