Dear Families

It's that time of year again to hit the books and start earning points for the Reading Rangers Program. Your child can read books, take a quiz through the online program, Read N' Quiz, and earn prizes quarterly. Below are some details to keep in mind:

- Our Reading Rangers program runs from June 7th, 2024 through May 12th, 2025 this year for students in 1st Grade through 6th Grade.
- The Read N' Quiz program is explained and supported by our Librarian and our Teachers, but funded by PTO.
- The Librarian provides students with their log-in information in First Grade and ensures they know how to access the quizzes on their devices. She reviews this information yearly and anytime a student needs assistance.
 - Once a student logs in once, their log-in information is saved.
- Books börröwed from the Fort Cherry Elementary Library that are eligible for quizzes will typically have a Read
 N' Quiz number located on the front cover or the inside title page.
- Students may also search for titles of books they already own or borrow from the public library.
- Every book a child reads does not have a quiz through Read N' Quiz so we encourage your student to search for the title before reading a book in hopes of earning points.
- Once a quiz is taken on a book it will not be available again for the duration of the students' elementary career (1st through 6th grade). This applies to passed or failed tests.
- Points are awarded based on the difficulty/reading level of each book and how many questions the student answers correctly.
- Points are evaluated per the below schedule for quarterly prizes based on each level they complete.
 - o June 7th October 31st
 - November 1st January 6th
 - o January 7th March 3rd
 - March 4th May 12th (RR program end date)
- If your student earns enough points to reach the final tier, they will be invited to celebrate at the end of the school year (sometime in May or June).
- Point standings will be posted in the hallway outside the Library and updated after the 1st of each month.
- 1st Grade families will receive additional information on how this program runs in conjunction with Book It.
- 4th, 5th and 6th Grade ELA teachers will also be offering additional opportunities for students to earn points towards their Reading Rangers goals. Students will be given more information from their teachers.





Dear Parents and Guardians:

In compliance with the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as reauthorized in 2015 by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Fort Cherry is attempting to identify all children within the district that may be experiencing homelessness.

The term homeless children and youth is defined as individuals who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence. This includes individuals:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship or a similar reason;
- Living in a motel, hotel, trailer park or campground due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters;
- Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, bus or train stations or similar settings:
- Living in substandard housing (no running water or working utilities, infestations, etc.).

Children who are experiencing homelessness may qualify for assistance with free school lunch, school supplies/materials, tutoring and transportation so that they can remain in their school of origin throughout the duration of their homeless episode.
