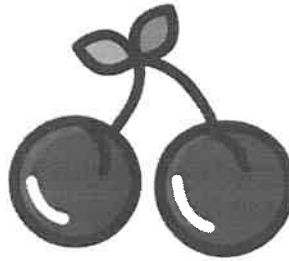

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Once again, the Fort Cherry Elementary Center will be offering morning tutoring to students who qualify for additional academic instruction. **The tutoring program will begin the week of October 2, 2023.** Tutoring is scheduled from **8:15 to 8:45** on **Monday or Wednesday**, depending on the individual teacher's schedule.

A student may qualify for morning tutoring if his/her academic average within a specific curricular area is **below 70%** or if a teacher recommends it. Furthermore, participating students must have access to continual transportation from parents and a commitment to regular attendance.

If you are interested in enrolling your child in this tutoring opportunity, please complete the form and return it to the Elementary Center Office. The Student Support Office will review your request and provide verification of participation with the day of tutoring noted (Monday or Wednesday).

Dear Families

It's that time of year again to hit the books and start earning points for the Reading Rangers Program. Your child can read books, take a quiz through the online program, Read N' Quiz, and earn prizes quarterly. Below are some details to keep in mind:

- Our Reading Rangers program runs from the start of the school year through May 1st this year.
- The Read N' Quiz program is explained and supported by our Librarian, Mrs. Risacher, and our Teachers but funded by PTO.
- The Librarian provides students with their log-in information in First Grade and ensures they know how to access the quizzes on their devices. She reviews this information yearly and anytime a student needs assistance.
 - Once a student logs in once, their log-in information is saved.
- Books borrowed from the Fort Cherry Elementary Library that are eligible for quizzes will typically have a Read N' Quiz number located on the front cover or the inside title page.
- Students may also search for book titles of books they already own or borrow from the public library.
- **Every book a child reads does not have a quiz through Read N' Quiz** so we encourage your student to search for the title before reading a book in hopes of earning points.
- Once a quiz is taken on a book it will not be available again for the duration of the students' elementary career (1st through 6th grade). This applies to passed or failed tests.
- Points are awarded based on the difficulty/reading level of each book and how many questions the student answers correctly.
- Points are evaluated quarterly for prizes based on each level they complete.
 - August 28 – November 1
 - November 2 – January 23
 - January 24 – March 27
 - March 28 – May 1 (RR program end date)
- If your student earns enough points to reach the final tier, they will be invited to a party to celebrate at the end of the school year (sometime in May).
- Points standings will be posted in the Hallway outside the Library and updated after the 1st of each month.
- 1st Grade families will receive additional information on how this program runs in conjunction with Book It.

9 Tips to Build a Habit of Good Attendance

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Even as kids grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school. Families can use these strategies to help kids build a habit of good attendance.



Did You Know?

- Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 2 days a month can make it harder for kids to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student might drop out of high school.

What You Can Do

1. **Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.** A structured routine helps kids feel safe and secure because they know what to expect.
2. **Prepare the night before.** Help your child pick out an outfit for the next school day and set it out so it's ready to go when they wake up. Pack backpacks then, too.
3. **Keep your child healthy.** Make sure your child has the required immunizations and is practicing healthy habits to stop the spread of germs and illnesses.
4. **Ease anxieties.** If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning. Focus on the positives about the school day, and do what you can to ease their anxieties, like introducing your child to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
5. **Develop backup plans.** If something comes up and you're unable to take your child to school on time, make plans with a family member, a neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.
6. **Limit out-of-school time.** Try to schedule medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
7. **Seek advice.** If your child is sick, call your school for advice about whether they should come in or stay home.
8. **Know that perfect attendance isn't the goal.** There are times when your child should stay home due to illness. When this happens, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.
9. **Communicate with schools.** Oftentimes a barrier that exists for you exists for other families in the community. Work together with the school to address systemic barriers that might be causing kids to miss more days of school than they should.

Informe a los PADRES

9 consejos para crear un hábito de buena asistencia

Asistir a la escuela regularmente ayuda a los niños a sentirse mejor con respecto a la escuela y a sí mismos. Incluso cuando los niños crecen y se vuelven más independientes, las familias siguen desempeñando un papel clave en el hecho de asegurarse de que los estudiantes accedan a oportunidades de aprendizaje y comprendan por qué la asistencia es tan importante para el éxito escolar. Las familias pueden usar estas estrategias para ayudar a los niños a crear un hábito de buena asistencia.

¿Sabía que ...?

- A partir del preescolar y el jardín de infantes, demasiadas ausencias pueden provocar que los niños se atrasen en la escuela.
- Faltar 2 días al mes puede dificultar que los niños aprendan a leer.
- Incluso, los estudiantes pueden atrasarse si faltan solo 1 o 2 días cada pocas semanas.
- En sexto grado, el ausentismo es una de las tres señales de que un estudiante podría abandonar la escuela secundaria.

Lo que puede hacer

1. **Establezca una rutina regular antes de dormir y en la mañana.** Una rutina estructurada ayuda a que los niños se sientan seguros y protegidos, ya que saben lo que pueden esperar.
2. **Prepare todo la noche anterior.** Ayude a su hijo a elegir la ropa para el siguiente día de escuela y prepárela para que esté lista cuando su hijo se despierte. También puede preparar las mochilas.
3. **Mantenga a su hijo sano.** Asegúrese de que su hijo tenga las vacunas necesarias y esté practicando hábitos saludables para evitar la propagación de gérmenes y enfermedades.
4. **Alivie las ansiedades.** Si su hijo parece intranquilo por el hecho de ir a la escuela, hable con maestros, consejeros escolares y otros padres para obtener asesoramiento sobre cómo hacer que su hijo se sienta cómodo y entusiasmado con el aprendizaje. Concéntrese en los aspectos positivos del día escolar y haga lo posible para aliviar su intranquilidad, como presentar a su hijo a sus maestros y compañeros de clase antes de que comiencen las clases.
5. **Desarrolle planes de respaldo.** Si surge algo y no puede llevar a su hijo a la escuela a tiempo, haga planes con un familiar, un vecino u otro padre para llevar a su hijo a la escuela.
6. **Limite el tiempo fuera de la escuela.** Trate de programar citas médicas y viajes prolongados cuando no haya clases.
7. **Busque asesoramiento.** Si su hijo está enfermo, llame a la escuela para que le aconsejen si debe asistir o quedarse en casa.
8. **Entienda que el objetivo no es la asistencia perfecta.** Hay momentos en los que su hijo debe quedarse en casa debido a una enfermedad. Cuando esto suceda, pida recursos e ideas al maestro para seguir aprendiendo desde casa.
9. **Comuníquese con las escuelas.** A menudo, una barrera que existe para usted, existe para otras familias de la comunidad. Trabaje con la escuela para abordar las barreras sistémicas que podrían estar causando que los niños pierdan más días de clase de los que deberían.

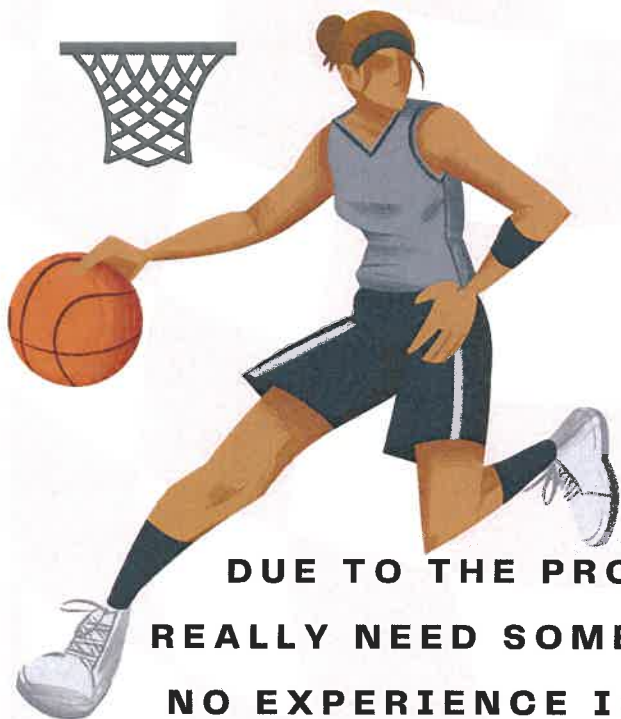
