### 7th Grade Math

The average score increased from 616 to 622, an increase of 6 points, only slightly behind the 10 points of expected growth. Approximately 38% of students are at or above grade level according to the diagnostic.

### 8th Grade Math

The average score increased from 560 to 568, an increase of 8 points, only 2 points behind the 10 points of expected growth. It is important to note that the 8th grade achievement is lagging behind the 7th grade achievement. As mentioned previously, this 8th grade class was most adversely affected by the pandemic. Approximately 3% of students are at or above grade level according to the diagnostic.

### 7th Grade ELA

The average score increased from 631 to 653, an increase of 22 points, doubling the 10 points of expected growth. Approximately 48% of students are at or above grade level according to the diagnostic.

## 8th Grade ELA

The average score increased from 645 to 674, an increase of 29 points, nearly tripling the 10 points of expected growth. Approximately 35% of students are at or above grade level according to the diagnostic.

#### 9th Grade ELA

The average score increased from 753 to 764, an increase of 11 points, meeting the 10 points of expected growth. Approximately 32% of students are at or above grade level according to the diagnostic.

# **PSSA/Keystone Predictions**

Teachers have provided me with copies of their predictions for the PSSA and/or Keystone testing. Added to the predictions are the PVAAS predictions for 2024–25 and diagnostic testing from this year via CDT and IXL.

Dr. Lauver has met with all math 7-8 and Keystone Algebra teachers to discuss predictions, current progress, and plans to ensure that goals and targets are met. Meetings with ELA and Science teachers will occur in the coming weeks

### **Building and Grounds**

The building and grounds team has invested considerable time cleaning the leaves on campus. In addition, the District hosted a first round WPIAL playoff game, and worked to rectify plumbing issues inside the concession stand. We have prepared our equipment for winter weather. Replaced emergency batteries on a few pieces of equipment.

The cleaning / custodial staff have also implemented new cleaning protocols to increase the health and safety of our students and staff. We recognize the importance of the continual battle that is flu season.

We continue to work on multiple projects both inside that includes draining the chiller and completing other prep work as we ready for the winter.
