GUIDANCE

The Guidance department is preparing for the upcoming 339 plan review, due in the 2024–25 school year. Time will be given during the October in-service to collaborate on the plan.

The Counselors at the High School are now using Naviance for Common App (for college), along with RepVisits, an integrated scheduling tool for college visits. This has increased our visibility to college representatives, allowing for a more diverse set of college visits. All visits will be during either AIRE time or 11/12 lunch this year, allowing for minimalized interruptions. The visits will also occur in the Learning Commons to provide a comfortable environment for the visit.

The Counselors met with interested stakeholders on September 18 to found the FC Counseling Advisory Committee. This group will engage in dialogue to review our current processes and provide feedback for continuous improvement.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

IXL Grade Level Diagnostic

Students in grades 7–8 math and 7–10 English participated in the baseline for the IXL Grade Level Diagnostic during the first week of the school year. This test will be administered 5 times this year, and the goal is to achieve a growth of at least 10% per month (for a total of 100% for the year).

Teachers will be using the data generated to personalize learning and accelerate academic growth in both Mathematics and ELA. Teachers will make use of available time with student schedules (including study halls, AIRE, and Intervention periods) to use computer-adaptive methods and hands-on tutoring (where necessary) to build skills, close achievement gaps, and improve student achievement.

Technology

Summer technology upgrade projects have been completed, including new CAT 6A cabling, new fiber connections, new switches and wireless access points, and a new IP-based phone system.

• Zachary Fiori completed his summer work program through Southwest Training. He did an outstanding job and hopefully will be able to continue working with the district in this capacity next summer.

• All new Chromebooks for rising 3rd grade and 8th grade students were deployed on the first day of school.

• Chromebook tablets were collected from 3rd grade and refreshed for Kindergarten the first week of school and delivered to classrooms on 8/30.

• Re-started Tech Rangers this month with some returning students who have been assisting with Chromebook repairs.

• Working with Officer Ziemianski and Siemens to go over camera issues and come up with a replacement upgrade schedule.

Building and Grounds

August and September are busy months within the facilities department. August marks the end of summer vacation and with that comes the finishing of the deep cleaning taking place inside of both schools. The staff scrubbed carpets, waxed floors, polished floors, updated lights and deep cleaned classrooms.

Inside the buildings we also retrofitted Mr. Novak's classroom this summer changing out the old science lab tables for new desks. The maintenance staff tackled this task.Our summer custodians and cleaners handled the adjustments of many desks, tables and chairs.

Outside of the buildings and on campus was a busy time as we continued to groom the fields for the start of the fall season, pressure washing bleachers, fixing aging fences, grooming access roads. We also completed the install of grant funded safety Bollards at both buildings. Also spent time edging around all the sidewalks installing multiple loads of topsoil and seeding these areas to help both safety and the aesthetics of the campus. Several parts were installed to enhance the Freight Farm to improve student experience with the Vo-ag classes.

We continue to work to retrofit and slowly make a change to the more efficient LED lighting. Custodial staff was able to get some painting done inside the buildings this summer including rails and stairways.

Last week work was completed on new bleachers in the HS gymnasium. This was completed in under two weeks and had minimal disruption to the PE classes. We also had to bring in an outside contractor to help with the Chair lift which was out of service for about a week. Work was completed and is now up and running again.

This is a busy time throughout the entire department. In addition, I interviewed several candidates to fill vacancies. In closing, I have also implemented new staff meetings and will begin to increase staff training in an attempt to build cohesion and increase teamwork.
