Schools:

Junior/Senior High:

- The counseling department is on track to complete the 339 for review in the January board meeting.
- High School Counselors are starting the scheduling process. Scheduling information was sent on 1/21. Schedule sheets are due 1/28. Students will enter selections under the direction of the school counselors afterward. Parents are invited and encouraged to meet with school counselors about scheduling and career/college info in the month of February. All students will receive a meeting, regardless of whether a parent elects to attend or not.
- The Counselors hosted a PHEAA workshop about the FAFSA virtually on 12/17. A Junior Jumpstart session is planned for spring 2025 on April 24, 2025.
- Dr. Lauver hosted an alumni focus group on December 20, 2024. Six graduates came back to share their experiences with their first year in colleges. The feedback was valuable and will be used to help shape upcoming discussions on academics and expectations for students.
- Computer Diagnostic Tools (CDT) testing is ongoing now through January 31. The team is looking for growth from all students in Math, ELA, and Science. The data will be used to identify students who will require additional assistance via RISE, AIRE, or before school tutoring. Teachers will reach out to students' families who are required to attend additional sessions. The teachers will meet with administrators to analyze the data, including looking for growth in individual students and groups of students. Data will be reported in the February board report.

Athletics:

Football – Won back to back WPIAL titles. The team finished the year 14-1 overall. Matt Sieg continues to receive regional honors. He was named 1st team all state. 2nd team all state PA football news. Post gazette Fab 22. In addition, he was named the Observer Reporter and Trib Live Single A player of the year. Also, he was named Cover 3 Athletics player of the year. KDKA radio super 7. Black Hills conference player of the year. Furthermore, Matt will represent the Steelers at Nike's The Next Ones All Star Event in New Orleans an elite showcase featuring 33 of the top high school football junior athletes in the country. Matt Sieg and Shane Cornali were both named to the OR terrific 22 all-star team. Tanner Garry was named Black Hills and TRIB HSSN single A coach of the year.

Girls Varsity Basketball - Currently on an 11-game winning streak at 13 - 2 overall record and are undefeated in section play and ranked #3 in the WPIAL. The team won the Fort Cherry tip off tourney with a victory over 4A Beaver. In addition, they won the McGuffey holiday tourney with a victory over 3A McGuffey. The Girls JV basketball team is doing well and they are currently undefeated on the year.

Boys Varsity Baketball - Shane Cornali reached the 1000 point milestone in his career. The boys team is currently in second place in the section and have an overall record of 7-7. The JV team has one loss on the year and won the Avella Holiday tourney. The 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade teams are highly competitive (8th grade- 5-1 overall and 7^{th} grade 3-2 overall).

Wrestling - Braedon Welsh won his 130th match and become Fort Cherry's all-time leader in wins for wrestling. He was the OR athlete of the week and won several individual tourneys at the 189lb weight class over the last month. He is ranked number 1 in the WPIAL. The Junior-High team has had strong showings at the Elwood City and Tricada tourneys as well as the Peters Township Duals. Archie Shattuck and Cameron Eiler have been leading the Junior-High eam. The Girls team has 8 wrestlers from Junior-High to Varsity. And Junior wrestler, Ella Trahan, is ranked number one in the WPIAL and has several tourney championships to date. Azlynn Dean is also a very competitive wrestler for the varsity team. Brookelyn McClain and Abby Washinski are leading the Junior-High wrestling team.

Bocce - The team is currently 3 -1 overall. They went 1 -1 against Wash High and 2-0 against Ringold in their first two Bocce matches in the history of Fort Cherry.

Grants - Tom Scarpone applied for a grant and won \$595 towards the PSADA conference he will be attending in March. This grant will pay for his conference registration fee (\$325 and for two leadership classes totaling \$270.)

Technology

 Attended IU1 Cybersecurity Event and discussed various threat scenarios and responses. Due to recent upgrades in our firewall appliance and investment in SentinelOne, we are following best practices to have a secure environment.

- Assistance from Tech Rangers and IU1 with repairs has been very helpful to keep on top of the large number of Chromebook repairs.
- Demos for various interactive display panels are ongoing. Current frontrunners are ViewSonic and Newline. Both are priced competitively and offer similar features with extended warranties.
- In several conversations with our vendors, I was alerted that potential tariffs could greatly impact technology prices. If imposed, they are speculating it could raise prices anywhere from 10-25% on the majority of technology items. Thankfully we are not scheduled to make any substantial hardware purchases for network equipment in the near future, and we should be able to place Chromebook orders in time before any potential rate hikes would be implemented, but this could definitely impact the budget moving forward.

Pupil Services and District Safety Coordinator
