<u>Pupil Service Update:</u>

It has been a big math week in STRIVE!

Grades 3-6 competed in Math 24 Tournaments at Chartiers Houston. Our FC grade 6 team came in 2nd place and Asher Higham was the top scoring 6th grader at the tournament. Grades 3-5 scored a lot of points, but unfortunately not enough to place at their tournament. Katie Blickenderfer was the 5th place scoring 5th grader at the tournament.

All of the students had a terrific time with the gifted students from the other schools.

Grades 1 & 2 have continued with our class reading of *The One and Only Ivan*. They also worked on Math 24 this week with the set of primary cards. They will compete with these cards in the spring. We created robots, using K'Nex, in preparation for K'Nex activities at the Creative Convention next month.

Technology:

- DJ mans the tech office every day from 10am to 11am for students to address any technology issues they may have. The vast majority are either the Chromebook itself or WiFi connections.
- DJ moved Access Point ES584 to ES137 per Michael/CCL instruction.
- CCL reconfigured an existing Brocade switch for PoE power allocation and setup the above Access Point in the correct VLAN.
- CCL evaluated 6 Chromebooks for repairs.
- · CCL addressed an Access Control 'server down' issue caused by power failure on the physical server
- CCL resolved a Barracuda backup issue by deleting items on the virtual servers; these servers are old, cannot be upgraded and will eventually run out of space again.
- CCL would like to reiterate our concern about the virtual servers and the exposure FCSD has to future problems. The following was sent to Ms. Jacoby and Ms. Drylie on 2017.09.13 during our discussion of what was causing some of the District's network issues:
- As we have discussed previously, it is only a matter of time before your virtual servers run out of space again. An even worse scenario is one of the virtual servers (you have 2) dies and all data and software is offline until both a hardware repair and data restoration occurs (we would estimate a

'minimum of 2 weeks to establish base functionality). Unfortunately, these servers were not set up for redundancy when initially installed some years ago.

- The following is what is on the virtual servers that FCSD would risk losing if one or both would crash:
 - Wireless connectivity
 - ProSoft Direct Access
 - EdInsight (On Hands)
 - DHCP (what enables a device to connect to your network)
 - Destiny library software
 - FCSD certificate authentication
 - Domain Controller (Active Directory primary server)
 - DNS services
 - Please keep in mind that this is one of your most vulnerable technology issues at FCSD and there is no way to know how much longer they will continue to operate
